A significant change occurred within the Air Force Association recently.

The IRS approved the tax exempt status of the Air Force Association, a significant change for corporate sponsors and individual financial supporters. Our local chapter was a flight lead for this action several

years ago when we established our own Aerospace Education Foundation to provide the tax-exempt organization that enabled us to step-up our sponsorship programs – which over 30+ sponsor partners did last year to the tune of \$194,000.

More importantly, this means that anyone can now be a full member in the Air Force Association, whether they have a military service background or not. This is a monumental change, particularly for Wright Memorial Chapter 212!

Wright-Patterson AFB proudly boasts one of the largest base civilian workforce in the country. Additionally, there are tens of thousands of non-military affiliated supporters across the Miami Valley. While the Air Force Association has always been an advocate for every part of the total force – civilian, enlisted, officer, active-duty, Guard/Reserve, retired – parts of total population were hesitant to join without full member status. That barrier is now gone.

The task now is to get the word out and ensure everyone understands that the AFA, and more specifically WMC Chapter 212, is working for YOU! Our mission remains the same:

- Educate the public about the critical role of aerospace power in the defense of our nation
- Advocate aerospace power and a strong national defense
- Support the Air Force and the Air Force Family

You need to know (and tell others) how we actually accomplish that mission and support Wright-Patterson AFB and, more importantly, you. Perhaps you weren't aware of the following

- The Wright-Memorial Chapter hosts the Air Force Ball for the Wright-Patterson AFB family – over 425 individuals attended last September's event (put Friday 8 Sep on your calendar).
- The WMC supports a chalet (actually several) at the Dayton Air Show that provides a great venue for watching everything from the first to the latest aerospace technology in action. Tickets are provided to our Star-Sponsors and individual tickets are available as well. Call Jim Heitz or myself if you have questions (29-30 Jul)
- The WMC provides significant funding support to the National Museum of the United States Air Force, the National Aviation Hall of Fame, and the Wright B Flyer at its Springboro hangar.
- The WMC provides significant infrastructure and funding support to the AFIT Lecture Series and provide scholarships to the Community College of the AF
- WMC supports over 160 classrooms in the local area through the Visions program (now the second largest in the country) that provides copies of USA Today and other resources to teachers to assist with a variety of subject areas that link directly to state and local skills and testing

NINE DOOLITTLE RAIDERS SCHEDULED TO PARTICIPATE IN REUNION AT THE NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE U.S. AIR FORCE

DAYTON, Ohio - The Doolittle Raiders, a group that helped restore American morale during World War II, are scheduled to celebrate their 64th annual reunion at the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force from April 17 through 21.

Nine of the surviving 16 Raiders are scheduled to attend the reunion, which will include several public events such as a dinner and lecture, memorial service, exhibit dedication and autograph sessions.

A memorial service will be held at the museum's Memorial Park on Tuesday, April 18, at 2 p.m. An autograph session with the Doolittle Raiders will follow the service.

On Wednesday, April 19, an exhibit ceremony dedicating the Doolittle Raider goblets will be held in the museum's Modern Flight Gallery at 9:30 a.m., and an additional autograph session will take place from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Also Wednesday, a dinner, lecture, and performance by the Air Force Band of Flight will take place in the Modern Flight Gallery from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. The cost for this event is \$50 per person. Please call 937-255-8046, ext. 496 or email leslie.greaser@wpafb.af.mil for more information.

On April 18, 1942, Lt. Col. James H. Doolittle led a successful bombing mission of military targets in principal cities of Japan, along with 79 airmen of the U.S. Army Air Forces, flying 16 B-25 Mitchell based land bombers. They took off from the U.S. Navy carrier Hornet and accomplished a feat believed impossible at the time.

The major results of the Doolittle-led raid were the material damage; the severe psychological shock to the Japanese and a great boost to American morale; Japanese land, sea, and air forces were recalled to protect the Japanese homeland; and the Battle of Midway was directly precipitated by the raid.

The mission is considered a classic in the annals of aerial warfare because of the daring use of Army land-based bombers from a carrier in joint operations with the Navy.

The Apollo 13 Mystery Challenge provides an inquiry based, hands-on workshop for all teachers. In a fast paced, timed format, teachers will develop and test a "blythe" vehicle capable of rescuing the crew safely. The activity is based on the National Science Content standards for science as inquiry, physical science (force and motion) and science and technology (design). Mathematics extensions will be identified. Participants will receive handout materials to use in their classrooms. Safety fly zones will be addressed and participants will wear eye protection. This activity drew high marks as part of the National Civil Air Patrol Cadet Competition in June 2005.

Cell Phone Restrictions While Driving on WPAFB

**The following is an announcement by
Col Weaver, the Wright-Patterson AFB Commander.**

Many of you have heard the Defense Department is prohibiting the use of cell phones while driving on federal installations, unless you are using a hands-free device. Our base will implement the restriction tomorrow, 4 April.

For the next 30 days Security Forces will issue warnings to those who violate the policy. Starting 4 May, Security Forces will issue citations to violators of the policy. Citations will assess 3 points to your on-base driving privileges. Drivers who amass 12 points within one year, or 18 points within two years, will lose their on-base driving privileges for 6 months.

We are implementing this restriction to improve safety for all the members of our community. If you have any questions about this new policy, please call Security Forces at 257-3784.

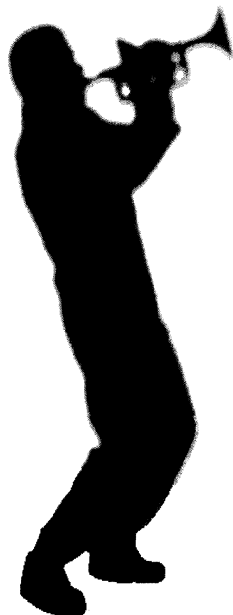

THE DAYTON CHAMBER TAKES ON THE BRAIN DRAIN

New Program hopes to help alleviate a graying workforce

As many of us know, graduating from college and assimilating into the professional community is by no means easy. Networking and knowing the “right” people can mean the difference between having a rewarding career and just having a job. However, peer in the window at Wright Patterson Air Force Base and Gen-Xers (now in their mid 20s to mid 30s) are hard to find. According to the Baccalaureate and Beyond survey 35% of students receiving degrees from Ohio colleges left the state in 2001. In order to retain Dayton’s future leaders, the Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce, is introducing Generation Dayton a dynamic new program geared toward the Dayton region’s next generation of leaders.

The Dayton area has a proud tradition of support for Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. As the fifth largest employer in the state, Wright Patterson Air Force Base employs nearly 22,000 people. 10,000 of these workers are civilians. The average age of these civilians is expected to reach 50 by 2007. Years of constrained hiring in the 1990s has left the Pentagon with a civilian workforce that is heavily skewed toward older employees.

Retaining and attracting younger skilled workers will become an important strategy for the Air Force and all of the Department of Defense. Programs like Generation Dayton will help retain young professionals who are seeking employment as civilians with Wright Patterson Air Force Base. By providing a program that seeks to maintain a qualified pool of

workers, the Dayton Chamber is taking steps to ensure that the base will continue to be a large contributor to the local economy.

Recognizing that the average age of an Air Force officer is 35, and 47% of all airmen and women are younger than 26, Generation Dayton will also provide a link between young officers and the Dayton community at large. Professional and personal development programs and seminars focused on networking, career management and leadership development are already planned for 2006. Civic and community involvement is another component of the program. By engaging young people, the program will help participants develop ties with the Dayton area.

United States Air Force Core Values

I continue to be honored to serve with you as Secretary of this great Air Force. Whether on the ground, in air or space, or on the new frontier of cyberspace – and whether you wear uniforms or civilian clothes – you respond to daily challenges that embody our core values of *Integrity First*, *Service Before Self*, and *Excellence in All We Do*.

These core values reflect the values we share from the moment we take our oath to support and defend the constitution. We must continue to reflect on these values, linked to that oath. Sharing my thoughts in this note is part of that ongoing process.

Integrity First reminds us we must “walk the talk” – our words and actions must be *integrated* in our lives. It reminds us of Thomas Jefferson’s concept of *moral muscles* – that we build and strengthen our character through the daily exercise of words, actions, and decisions. *Integrity first* means not only physical courage, but moral courage as well, so that we sometimes stand up by speaking up. It means being loyal to our friends, to each other – *by being loyal to our oath, our Air Force, and our Nation*.

Service Before Self is not the same as “service,” a value also claimed by some civilian institutions and corporations. Our *Service* requires sacrifice and commitment to our Nation. We understand we make decisions in an environment where freedoms are on the line, and lives are at stake. *Service Before Self* begins with duty, but it means more. It means that, in our Air Force, as we fly and fight in war and peace, going *above-and-beyond-the-call-of-duty* is not the exception – it is the rule.

Excellence in All We Do reminds us, at the most basic level, of the old “Hometown Newspaper Test” – imagining our parents reading about our actions, and wanting them to be proud. But it also includes the military concept of honor – knowing our actions reflect on all Airmen – and on the Air Force itself. It reminds us that we stand on the shoulders of giants: heroes like Billy Mitchell and Doolittle, Spaatz, and Rickenbacker; heroes who faced and beat incredible odds. We have inherited a history of excellence, courage, and greatness. We must live up to that heritage, become part of it, and pass it on.

All airmen are men and women of character. Our enduring *Air Force Core Values* provide a touchstone as we rise to meet current and future challenges, threats, and opportunities. As America’s Airmen, it is imperative that we maintain the moral high ground – our nation depends on it. I thank all of you for your contributions and sacrifices. *I salute you!*

- WMC provides funding support for unit events and numerous family support activities, such as the Heroes Welcoming Heroes event for returning deployed members/families, the Spouse Support program, the Fisher-Nightingale House and Family Day Picnics for 88th ABW, 445th MW and 178th RW
